The Australian Curling Federation (ACF) is pleased to announce its adoption of the updated National Integrity Framework (Framework) in partnership with Sport Integrity Australia.

The Australian Curling Federation's updated National Integrity Framework came into effect on 1 January 2024 and consists of five integrity-related policies, including:

-  Member Protection Policy
-  Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy
-  Competition Manipulation and Sport Gambling Policy
-  Improper Use of Drugs and Medicine Policy
-  Complaints, Disputes and Discipline Policy

There are no changes to the Framework's intent or behaviours not acceptable in sport but there are changes in relation to the investigation of complaints. Complaints relating to Prohibited Conduct under the Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy or alleged Discrimination under the Member Protection Policy will continue to be managed by Sport Integrity Australia. All other integrity complaints will now be dealt with by the ACF National Integrity Manager. Complaints related to other Curling policies, such as Selection Policy disputes, will remain with the ACF.

It is important that all members and participants of Curling understand their obligations under this Framework and in particular familiarise themselves with conduct which is prohibited within each policy.
